#### A Mid-Year View from the Bridge

As we maintain our course through the midyear point of 2024,

it's time to reflect on our journey thus far and share some highlights with you.

Last November, we set sail into the 46th year of SOS, anticipating a year filled with exciting programs and projects. In early December, the new Board and Chairs convened, setting goals and an agenda to guide our way. Then, in a huge boost to get us underway, there was the unforgettable" Best in Show" win at the EYC Lights Parade! Thanks to Chuck and Julie Fort, Janet Gonski and Gabi Van Wie and all the crew.

More success followed. The start of our Brunch season saw an engaging talk and captivating photography from Mark Hergan. Mark's generosity in donating some of his work to the club sparked enthusiasm among members, culminating in a lively silent auction in April. Thanks to Linda Perkins for organizing this.

Our April photo review and awards program, coupled with a General Membership meeting, provided a platform for constructive discussions, including a thorough budget review led by Craig Coltharp. While we currently sail in the black, we are close-hauled and forecast a small year-end deficit primarily due to general administrative and operational costs. We are exploring many different avenues to avoid this.

Our membership numbers hold steady at 406. Over the past four years, 130 new members have joined, representing 32% of our community. Our focus moving forward will be on retaining members, as well as diversifying by welcoming more men aboard (we are at 39.5%). Thanks to John McDonald, Pat Tracey and Sandra Rosswork for following up on member renewals. As well, Janet Gonski continues her tireless and creative Public Affairs efforts. On the social scene, Josh Graf has revived the Baltimore Happy Hours.

In the realm of policies and procedures, we've adapted our COVID policy into a flexible Wellness policy, thanks to the efforts of Karl Scible and Michelle Watters. Additionally, we've updated our personnel policies to ensure a safe and inclusive environment for all crew and skippers, guided by principles of respect and equality.

The dedication of our volunteers continues to amaze. Lora Donia is revitalizing the First Mates program, recruiting applicants and revising the checkout and competency requirements. Chuck Fort has volunteered "At Last" as the touch and go boat for the FM cruise.

Deb Kauffman and Janet Pennewell are working tirelessly on our Bareboat adventures. From the BVIs to Mallorca, to New Zealand and beyond (maybe Canada?) our charter cruises offer unforgettable experiences for our members. Additionally Laura Gwinn is leading the planning for an extended cruise in the southern Chesapeake!

We've successfully executed our major program events. Eighty-six cruising days are on the calendar; there's a new BLAST every week anticipating the next two weeks of cruises. Our spring training included 130 registrants; there were 70 at Flare and Safety, 56 at Dockside training (hosted by 7 skippers!). Thanks to all of the volunteers and the leadership of Jean, Dennis, Carole, and Joan.

Behind the scenes, we've strengthened cruise reporting and database work with Carrie Will

### The 2024 "Dinghy Dance!"

Are you good at getting into a dinghy in deep water? That's one of the things we work on at the Dinghy Dance.



This fun training session focuses on the

effective and safe use of dinghies. Since the training is held at a member's private pool with a real dinghy, we are able to jump into the water and practice getting in and out of a dinghy on land and in deep water.

We test some of the techniques that experienced dinghy users rely on, like a stepping strap or a line with knots in it tied across the dinghy. Last year almost every participant who tried to get into the dinghy in deep water was able to using our tried-and-true techniques!

In addition, we have videos on different types of PFDs, how to put a PFD on in the water, which PFDs will give you the most protection if you fall out of a boat, and a video on how to inspect and maintain your Inflatable PFD.

We jump in the pool wearing different types of PFDs to experience how they vary.

We even have two people jump in with an inflatable PFD so participants can observe how the inflatable reacts.

The Dinghy Dance is scheduled for **Sunday, July 21 from 1:00 to 3:30.** Bring a towel and wear a bathing suit because we are not offering a place to change your clothes. Space is limited, so sign up soon!

### How do I Register For a Sail?

The Sailing Season is Upon Us ~ FINALLY and new members have questions:

How do I register for a sail?

When will I know the pertinent details of the sail?

The process is as follows: Check the "Fleet exercise and Shore Leave" section of the Whisker Pole (WP) the first week it is available. For any event announced in the WP, the coordinator is ready to receive registrations, even if the event date is two months away. Signing up early significantly increases your chances of securing a spot on a boat, so it's always a good idea to register as soon as possible.

How to Register: To register for a sail, start by logging on to the SOS website. Once you're on the home page, locate the Event Calendar on the right side. Click on the Event Calendar, navigate to the month and date of the desired event, and click on the specific date. A simple registration form will appear. Fill out the form completely.

It is important to update your SOS profile, particularly your skill and fitness level. This information will automatically be reflected in your registration. Finally, pay online using your credit card. You will receive a confirmation email and/or invoice, which ensures your registration is complete

Deadlines: Pay special attention to the event's deadline because the coordination is usually scheduled the day AFTER the deadline.

At the coordination, registered crew members are recommended/offered to the registered skippers. Usually, the skipper emails his/her crew members with pertinent information the next day or so. If you are not placed on a boat, the coordinator will email those crew members stating this. But wait! Some skippers call the coordinator after the coordination and ask for crew, so there is still a chance a registered crew member can go sailing.

Let's go sailing!

### SOS Wellness Protocol Revised (3/7/2024)

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are "feeling like something is coming on," have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection. In addition, a skipper/host may have further requirements or request other preventive measures (for example, crew or guests having received the currently recommended COVID-19 vaccine or wearing masks when below deck). All in-person participants should expect to be denied admission without a refund if they fail to comply with this policy.
