#### CBDB IS BACK FOR 2025 by Laura Gwinn

Does lots of sailing without the cost of flights or charters appeal to you? How about exploring new rivers, creeks, ports of call in the comfort of a boat you are familiar with.

The Chesapeake Bay Domestic Bareboat (CBDB) aka the Extended Bay Cruise, is back for 2025. Mark your calendars for 10 days to 2 weeks May 24-June 8.

While details are still being discussed, the general plan will be to go from the Memorial Day cruise on the Choptank /Little Choptank to Yorktown (2 days) and Cape Charles (2 days) then work our way back up the Bay.

Each boat will be responsible for their expenses, although there will be a small cruising fee for crew.



There will be a suggested itinerary, but each boat will determine how closely they want to follow it. Decide for yourself if you want to anchor or use a marina; do you want to go to a different destination?

Skippers will be responsible for inviting their own crew, although I will maintain a list of interested crew to share with Skippers who may need additional members.

#### This is the last brunch of the season. Don't miss it!

Did you submit photos for the Annual Retrospective or the Annual Photo Contest or to Bob Wright for the *Whisker Pole* photo pages? You can see them all at the April Brunch up on the big screen. Every year there are two special events for the club's photographers to show off their talents.

The Photo Retrospective is a videoslide show, set to music, of photos taken by club members, new and old. at club activities on land and water. John Parsons labored for many hours over 300+ photos submitted of people, places, and boating events to bring back memories of 2024. Did vou send in photos of Fireside Chats. Seminars. Spring Training, Brunches, Day Sails, or Bareboat Cruises - to name just a few of the Club activities? If so, your photos are likely to be in the video-slide show so of course you want to see them.

They will make us laugh, exchange stories, and retell tall tales of our adventures, but most of all, we will remember those wonderful moments we had with sailing mates, at home and abroad. The video-slide show will be shown throughout the brunch until the competition winners are announced.

Also starring YOU, our members, is the second photography event: "You Ought to be in Pictures." This competition is of photos taken by amateur club members of club events and has become rather competitive. Contestants submitted as many as eight unedited photos in 5" x 7" format.

The four winning categories are People, Bay Scenes, Sailboats (under sail or as a scenic photo), and Destination Cruises. The destination cruises were taken traveling before, during, or after a bareboat destination cruise. The photos are from the same area visited, not including layovers in other locations. The Photo Contest Manager is our own Bob Wright. He received the photos and organized them in a format to be judged.

There are First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories. There is also a Grand Prize Award (13 awards in total). The Judge may add a fourth-place or fifthplace awards in any category if deemed necessary due to the quantity and quality of the entries. The judging is blind (not knowing the photographers).

This year's Judge is David M. Blecman, of Positive Negatives LLC., he has been judging professionally for over 39 years, sometimes having over 260 images to evaluate, score, and judge in a single competition.

#### Your Medical Information Form Please Update and Take it Sailing!

The need to have an Emergency Medical Information Form on hand when we sail is not something we all like to think about, but in the event of an emergency it could be critical. SOS developed this form for members to have on hand "just in case." It's posted on the SOS web site under Forms and Such, Cruising.

On this form you put information on your emergency contacts, health conditions, medicines you are taking, health insurance information, and information contact for your doctor....all the information a medical professional might need to care for you in an emergency. To respect your privacy, most club members fill out their form and keep it in a sealed envelope. Have it addressed to you and put a stamp on it in case you forget it when they leave the boat!

When they sail, they leave their sealed envelope on the boat's nav station to be turned over to a medical professional in an emergency. When the member completes their sail, they take the sealed envelope back home with them to use on their next sail.

And yes...there have been times when a skipper and crew have been glad, they had this information readily available for medical specialists! So, if you haven't been carrying this form on sails...please start. And even if you have been...please make sure it's up to date.

Lastly, please make sure your emergency contact is someone we can call on in an emergency and their phone number is valid seven days a week. The Annapolis Fire Department EMTs (emergency medical technicians) think this is a great system that could make a big difference for them in handling an emergency!

#### **Dockside Training**

Where Spring Training Meets the Water - Learn about halyards and draft, which way's forward, and how to move aft!


Dockside Training is presented by the Cruising Committee without cost to all SOS members. It is held on various members' boats to give newly joined members and old salts who want a refresher or an introduction to a boat, on sailing with SOS, and a head start on checking off some Basic Skills. It is traditionally held on a boat while tied to the dock, although some Skippers elect to go out for a day sail.

Dockside Training is designed to answer such questions as: What tasks do the crew perform on a boat? How do I tie a clove hitch or stopper knot? What am I expected to do when leaving the dock? And more.

Skippers and First Mates will conduct standard pre-cruise and safety briefings and provide hands-on training. This is an EXCELLENT opportunity to get your Basic Skills Level I and possibly some of your Basic Skills Level II training checked off. Completion of the Basic Skills Level I is a <u>minimum skill requirement</u> for sailing as a crewmember on a weekend cruise.

**Preparing for Dockside Training** Please read the Basic Skills Manual Level I and II sections prior to Dockside Training and bring the Basic Skills checkout forms with you. The Manual and checkout forms are found on the SOS website in the Education Section of the Forms and Such tab.

If you are preparing for Basic Skills I you must study the nomenclature, practice the knots, and review the man overboard procedures. If time allows your skipper may start on the Basic Skills II review and/or checkout. If you are preparing for Basic Skills II please study the nomenclature, practice the knots, and review the points of sail. If time allows your skipper may start on the Basic Skills III review and/or checkout.



After you register, you will be **notified by email** regarding your boat/skipper assignment. Just pack your water bottle, picnic lunch, and Basic Skills form(s). Then head to your assigned SOS boat for hours of fun, learning, and camaraderie.

Register for Dockside Training on the SOS event calendar. Sign up for one session or all.

You have a choice of three days: April 19th immediately after Flare and Safety; April 27- all day, and July 19 all day. To register see Pg. 10.

- Docent-guided 90-minute tour of SERC research activity. Limited availability (20 per time slot). Sign up for the 10:00 am or 2:00 pm time slot.
- Hike or bicycle on the many trails available.
- Visit the Woodlawn House, a museum containing artifacts of Maryland History found on the property.
- Participate in an archaeological dig.
- Listen to a lecture on the French and Indian War by Jim Gibb (chief archaeologist).
- Join in a SOS pot-luck lunch at the pavilion at the Reed Center. (Bring food to share.)


